UNUSUAL WEATHER PHENOMENON: DUST DEVILS



A DUST DEVIL

A **dust devil** is a strong, well-formed, and relatively short-lived whirlwind, ranging from half a metre wide and a few metres tall to more than 10 m wide and 1 km tall. The primary vertical motion is upward.

Dust devils are usually harmless, but can on rare occasions grow large enough to pose a threat to both people and property.

They are comparable to tornadoes as both are a weather phenomenon involving a vertically oriented rotating column of wind.

Dust devils form as a swirling updraft under sunny conditions during fair weather, when a pocket of hot air near the surface rises quickly through cooler air above it, forming an updraft.

It rarely comes close to the intensity of a tornado.

MATHOPAEDIA

EXPLORING THE ROMAN NUMBER SYSTEM

Introduced by the ancient Romans, this number system consists of letters from the Latin Alphabet. There are seven letters in all, denoting different numerical values.

Symbol	<u>I</u>	<u>V</u>	<u>X</u>	<u>L</u>	<u>C</u>	<u>D</u>	<u>M</u>
Value	1	5	10	50	100	500	1,000

Though the world now mostly uses Arabic numerals for all purposes, the Roman Numerals are still a part of the Mathematics syllabus for school children, to make them aware of their origin, value and use.

RULES FOR WRITING ROMAN NUMERALS

1. The letters I, X, C can be repeated thrice in succession.
2. Additionally, L, V, D cannot be repeated or the number is considered to be invalid.
3. If a lower value digit is written to the left of a higher value digit, it is subtracted.
4. If a lower value digit is written to the right of a higher value digit, it is added.
5. Only I, X, and C can be used as subtractive numerals.

SUBTRACTION RULE

There is a simple rule which says that whenever the same symbol is written four times, it is replaced by subtracting it from the next higher number (5,50,50,500). That way, 4 is written as IV instead of IIII, 40 is written as XL instead of XXXX, etc. Usually only one number is subtracted, not two. So 18 is written as XVIII instead of IIXX.

THE YEAR 2022 IN ROMAN NUMERALS

2022 in Roman numerals is written as MMXXII. To convert 2022 into Roman Numerals:

1. We will write 2022 in the expanded form, i.e. $2022 = 1000 + 1000 + 10 + 10 + 1 + 1$
2. Thereafter replacing the transformed numbers with their respective roman numerals, we get $2022 = M + M + X + X + I + I = MMXXII$.

$$2022 = 2000 + 20 + 2$$

$$\text{Roman Numerals} = MM + XX + II$$

$$2022 \text{ in Roman Numerals} = MMXXII$$

Now Lets Find the value of 2151 - 2022.

Solution:

$$\text{Solving the given problem, } 2151 - 2022 = 129$$

To determine the value of 2151 - 2022 in Roman Numerals, we will express 129 in the expanded form, i.e. $129 = 100 + 20 + 9$
 $= C + XX + IX = CXXIX$.
