



**1956** - Delhi becomes a union territory of India.


**1956** - Madhya Pradesh was formed.




TEMPERATURE GRAPH

# MATHOPEDIA



The Fibonacci series is the set of numbers beginning with 1,1,1 where every number is the sum of the previous two numbers. The series begins with 1,1,2,3,5,8,13,1,1,2,3,5,8,13, and so on. The Fibonacci Sequence ( $F_n$ ) is the series of the numbers

0,1,1,2,3,5,8,13,21,34,...0,1,1,2,3,5,8,13,21,34,...and so on.

The next number is found by adding up the two numbers before it:

The number 2 is found by adding the two numbers before it ( $1+1$ ).

The number 3 is found by adding the two numbers before it ( $1+2$ )

The number 5 is ( $2+3$ ), the sum of the two numbers that come before it in the series. So on and so forth.

However, before Fibonacci wrote his work, the sequence  $F_n$  had already been discussed by Indian scholars, who had long been interested in rhythmic patterns that are formed from one-beat and two-beat notes.

The number of such rhythms having  $n$  beats altogether is  $F_{n+1}$ . Acharya Hemachandra, an Indian Mathematician, mentioned the numbers 1,2,3,5,8,13,21,...1,2,3,5,8,13,21,... explicitly in his findings and studies, fifty years before Fibonacci made his findings public. So today these numbers are referred to as Hemchandra Fibonacci Numbers, duly giving recognition to Acharya Hemchandra's findings.



### MR GURPREET SINGH JASWAL PGT PHYSICAL EDUCATION


